Regents Canal

Two centuries of London history have played out around the Regent's Canal. The waterway, which celebrated its bicentenary during the nationwide lockdown last year, has born witness to epoch-defining events, including the 1...... (industry) revolution and both World Wars. Its adjacent path can no longer be called under-the-radar; it's

both well-loved and well-trodden, and dodging bicycles while trying not to fall in is all *part and parcel* of a day out by the water.

Lea Valley Walk
